Author's Purpose, Methods & Results

Purpose: This academic paper explores the correlation between art connoisseurship and forensic science, especially in their historical development. The author proposed that forensic scientists should apply the methods of art connoisseurship (art analysis), such as historical and visual examinations. These methods ensure that scientists have refined observational and analytical skills, which are crucial to investigative work.

Methods: The author uses a qualitative approach in a few ways:

- Historical Review: She examines the historical development of shared methods and their applications.
- Comparative Analysis: Both disciplines study traces through observation and inference.
- Philosophical Inquiry: She describes both disciplines as “historical sciences”.

Results: Based on past studies and the works of influential historical figures, such as Giovanni Morelli, science and art connoisseurship share a similar methodological foundation.

Conclusions: Historically, studying art has shown to improve attention to detail. Therefore, fine art analysis can be used as a tool and should be integrated into forensic science education/training.

How is this relevant to my research?

My research aims to explore how forensic science techniques are essential to art analysis and detection of art forgeries, specifically, how and when certain techniques (ex: signature analysis) are used.
